WHAT IS THE AUSTRALIAN SPORTS TECHNOLOGIES NETWORK?

We have great pleasure in introducing the newly established Australian Sports Technologies Network (ASTN).



The ASTN is a national collaborative network focussed on developing Australia's sports technologies industry. We play a leadership role in assisting Australian organisations involved in sports technologies in developing research and commercial opportunities, both nationally and globally.

The ASTN is a not-for-profit member-based organisation comprising leaders across the entire 'sports eco-system' in Australia, including sports tech firms, national sporting organisations, sports retailers and marketers, universities, researchers, and investors.

Acknowledging the role that the ASTN can play in driving the commercialisation of sports technologies in Australia, the Federal Government provided seed funding to support its establishment. The ASTN was officially launched in Geelong on 26 April 2012.

Why establish the Australian Sports Technologies Network?

- Better capitalise on Australia's world class sporting reputation to promote sports technologies capability and development.
- Create a nationally recognised body to coordinate industry stakeholders to take advantage of domestic and international commercial opportunities.
- Provide a platform for key sports tech stakeholders to easily collaborate and pursue research and commercial opportunities.
- Maximise opportunities to commercialise sports technologies in both the professional and recreational market.
- Facilitate formal access to commercialisation expertise and investment capital to guide sports technologies development.

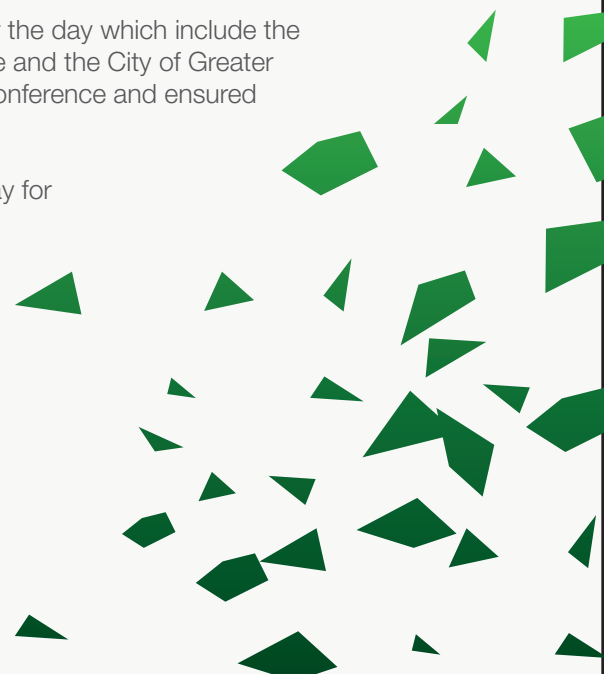

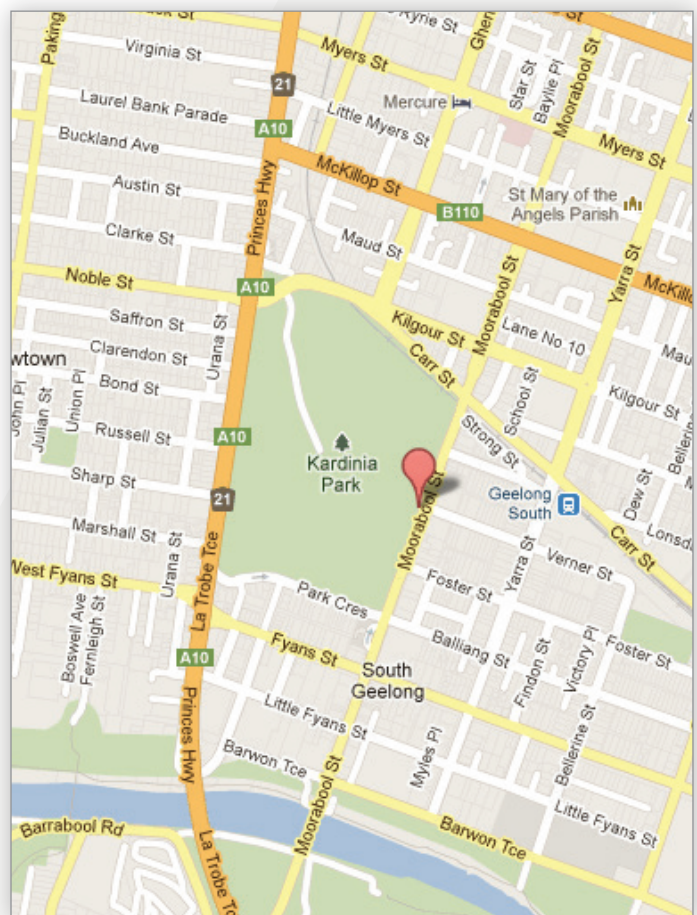
Location:
